



How to access Museum as Megaphone:

The steps outlined below are one-time to help you first create an account, then a "class," which allows you and your students or children to access the content.

1. Go to <https://icchallenge.org/>
2. Click on "create account" in the right-hand corner.
3. Select Teacher.
 - a. Even if you aren't a teacher, parents or caregivers should select this option.
4. Fill out Teacher Registration form and submit.
 - a. For "Challenge Join Code" enter the Challenge Code for the course you want:
 - i. Fifth Grade Art Experience: **8W8I9EGM**
 - ii. Love Letters to the Collection: **6RH219F2**
 - iii. Witness to Wartime: The Painted Diary of Takuichi Fujii: **PTUWSN3K**
 - b. For "Select School" type in your hometown.
5. Once your registration is complete, you are directed to the main dashboard page.
6. Click the plus button on the left-hand side that says "Create a Class,"
 - a. This will be how you access the Museum as Megaphone curriculum and content. You only have to do this step once.
 - b. For Class Name: Whatever you'd like – be creative! This information is not public – other users will not see your class name.
 - c. Number of Students: enter how many children will be participating with you.
 - d. Number of Teams: enter 1.
7. Once you've created your class, you will be re-directed to the dashboard.
 - a. Click on your class.
 - b. You can ignore the bottom half of the page with Teams, Team Management, etc as this is not needed to participate in Museum as Megaphone.
 - c. Click on green "View Challenge" button
8. You are now looking at Museum as Megaphone content
 - a. We recommend reading the background and scenario pages, but they are not necessary.
 - b. Click on the dark blue "Challenge Steps" button and read through at your own pace.
 - c. Then click on the subsequent numbered pages.
 - i. ****Please follow the pages in numerical order as they do build on each other.**
 - d. Watch the videos and follow along! Remember that you can stop and come back to the steps as needed, the program is not timed.
