Prompt:

Pitt's *Gorge Spirits Floating 2* uses symbols, characters, and a background that looks like water to create the image. Pitt includes symbols of her Tribal heritage to honor her American Indian cultural identity. She also emphasizes our responsibility to be good stewards of the environment by including references to water.

Steps:

- 1. **Brainstorm** symbols, characters, or places that represent and honor your own identity or ancestors. What types of environments or environmental elements might you connect to your heritage? Anything you come up with can be included in your drawing. Pitt often uses an image based on "She Who Watches", or Tsagaglal, a rock image carved into stone that can be found in Pitt's ancestral homelands, in the Columbia River Gorge area of Oregon.
- 2. **Draw** the images you came up with on your paper. Your drawings can be free-floating, like in Pitt's *Gorge Spirits Floating 2*, or can be organized in a different way. For example, you might want to draw in a way that shows a story or narrative.
- 3. **Add** in a background that references a place or environment that is important to you. Pitt often uses water as a background to show the relationship between humans and the natural world. You could use a contrasting material for the background.
